



# First Photographic Wintering Records of Chinese Pond Heron *Ardeola bacchus* and Squacco Heron *Ardeola relloides* from Nal Sarovar Bird Sanctuary Gujarat, India

#### **Abstract**

The bird Chinese pond heron A. bacchus, Squacco heron A. relloides and Javan pond heron A. speciosa are very closely related with Indian pond heron A. grayii. The Squacco A. relloides and Chinese pond heron A. bacchus are resembles of Indian pond heron A. grayii, so it is very indistinguishable during winter plumage. The bird Squacco heron A. relloides accurse in central and South-west Europe, Northwest Africa-Morocco, Aral seel, South-East Iran. During winter Migration Mediterranean and Middle East but main wintering site is in Tropica, sub-Sahara, Africa-Del hoyo [1], North-East Afghanistan, Turkistan-Rasmussen [2]. The bird Chinese pond heron A. bacchus is very widely distributed race, East and North-east Chine, South-west Japan, and Myanmar- del hoyo resident in northeast India and local movement elsewhere- Ali [3], rare and scarce in north-east India and Assam- Krys 2000 - 2012 [4]. Resident and winter visitor in north-east India- Grimett., et al. 2011 [5], resident and breeding in Assam in passage migrant east-Manipur but rare or scarce, vagrants coastal area of south-east Bangladesh and Sri Lanka- Rasmussen 2012. A. Choudhury gives it status uncommon and resident in Assam 2000. He included new records in his work. On 18th May 1993, he sited bird at Tingra district-Tinsukia, Assam, another record from south Assam-chacher district. When he was return back Hailakandi to Guwahati- South Assam 2008-Ib 5/6, two records from Western India. One from Saurastra region of Gujarat. Bird was sited near Bhavnagar (Saurastra) in May 1980 by Parasharya (Parasharya 1983; et al. 2004), another record from Rajasthan-Tal Chhapar wildlife sanctuary by S. poonia IB Vol 8/6. More records from south India- Tamil Nadu, Chennai by Samyak K. he observed at KelamBekkamlake-Chennai, on 13th March 2013-IB Vol 8/6. In this article I acquaintance about some my observation on Squacco heron A. relloides and Chinese pond heron A. bacchus, which I sited during birding trip of Sanctuary.

#### Observation area

Nal Sarovar birds sanctuary is located (22°45' N, 72°00'E) 65 Ahmedabad city, 50 km east from Surendranagar, spreaded over (With Vadla, Kamijala, Kumarkhan- Vekriya wetland) roughly 500 sq km. has more than 350 Island, with spectacular Natural shallow lake and muddy lagoons, also open water body and many other diverse and micro habitat Create attraction for remarkable waterfowl. So, it was declared Bird sanctuary in April1969 and as Ramsar site in 2012.


## Sighting of Chinese pond heron A. bacchus



Figure 1: On 8th of September, 2017, I was birding near Kamijala Lake, along Viramgam-Nal Sarovar bird sanctuary road. I sited and photographed bird like pond heron, it was differ in plumage than Indian Pond heron A. grayii. Bird was juvenile, has a pinkish brown bill, dark on tip, greenish-yellow base, chestnut-brown head, neck and wing coverts. Less brown on scapular and wing edge, long neck rofous-brown streaked throat and central strip white, greenish-yellow legs and toes with shorter tibia and long tarsus wings are long and pointed, both birds were very much like Chinese pond heron, not a single records are available in North-East, North-West and South-west of India. Thus these records had created a confusion and question about wintering records.

On 8th of September, 2017, I was birding near Kamijala Lake, along Viramgam-Nal Sarovar bird sanctuary road. I sited and photographed bird like pond heron, it was differ in plumage than Indian Pond heron *A. grayii*. Bird was juvenile, has a pinkish brown bill, dark on tip, greenish-yellow base, chestnut-brown head, neck and wing coverts. Less brown on scapular and wing edge, long neck rofous-brown streaked throat and central strip white, greenish-yellow legs and toes with shorter tibia and long tarsus wings are long and pointed, both birds were very much like Chinese pond heron, not a single records are available in North-East, North-West and South-west of India. Thus, these records had created a confusion and question about wintering records.

On 25<sup>th</sup> of October, 2019, I was birding near entrance of Nal Sarovar Bird Sanctuary, I observed pond heron differ in plumage than Indian. Has a long pointed bill with black tip and greenish-yellow base, upper mendable grey, lower base white is yellowish, cutting edge also yellow, large greenish-yellow orbital ring, chestnut-black mentle, rump, long greenish-yellow legs.



**Figure 2:** On 25<sup>th</sup> of October, 2019, I was birding near entrance of Nal Sarovar Bird Sanctuary, I observed pond heron differ in plumage than Indian. Has a long pointed bill with black tip and greenish-yellow base, upper mendable grey, lower mendable white on base, yellowish cutting, edge also yellow, large greenish-yellow orbital ring, chestnut-black mentle, rump, long greenish-yellow legs.

### Method

Fig. 1, 2 – Both birds were identified by consulting literature on birds. Birds were Chinese pond heron A. bacchus, but not a single wintering record are available from North, North-West, West, Central and South-West India. Thus I extended my observation for long time and included more site surrounding this lake.



Figure 3: Bird is probably a juvenile, has a short and pointed bill with greenish-yellow base, large greenish-yelow orbital ring, upper mendable dark brown tip, lower mendable pale, with yellow cutting edge. Dark brown head, mentale, back. Dark brown streaked breast and side of neeck, throat and central styrip white, greenish-yellow legs, with shorter tibia and long tarsus.

Bird is probably a juvenile, has a short and pointed bill with greenish-yellow base, large greenish-yelow orbital ring, upper mendable dark brown with tip, lower mendable pale, with yellow cutting edge. Dark brown head, mentale, back. Dark brown streaked breast and side of neeck, throat and central styrip white, greenish-yellow legs, with shorter tibia and long tarsus.




**Figure 4:** Long thick bill with black tip and yellow base, greenish-yellow orbital ring, upper mendable greenish-yellow on base, pale in centre, lower mendable white on base, centre pale yellow. Yellowish-brown streaked head, mentle rump and wing coverts maroon, greenish-yellow legs.


**Figure 5:** Yellowish brown streaked head and neck, throat and central strip white, long bill, yellow on base, tip dark,lower mendable yelow in centre, greenish-yellow large orbital ring, greenish yellow legs.


**Figure 6:** Maroon streaked head and neck, throat and central strip white, short thick bill, dark brown upper mendable, yelowish lower mendable, white on base, tip dark, greenish-yellow large orbital ring.

Figure 12 bird has a rofous-brown streaked head plumes, tonny buff mentle, pale four wings, heavily rofous-brown streaked on breast, yellow orbital ring, pinkish-brown upper mindable, lower mindable yellowish- brown with black tip, throat and center of neck, breast, belly, vent and thigh white, pale rofous brown mentle and rump.



Figure 13: Bird was perched in up-right stance, near reed bed, has a long slender neck, with dark brown streaked head plums and site of neck, throat and central streak white, yellow orbital ring, long pointed bill with upper mendable black, lower dark on base, central yellowish, dark tip, dark brown mentle and rump, silver-white wings edge, dull yellow legs, white on belly, breast and vent.

Figure 13 bird was perched in up-right stance, near reed bed, has a long slender neck, with dark brown streaked head plums and site of neck, throat and central streak white, yellow orbital ring, long pointed bill with upper mendable black, lower dark on base, central yellowish, dark tip, dark brown mentle and rump, silver-white wings edge, dull yellow legs, white on belly, breast and vent.

### **Comparison**

Indian Pond Heron *A. grayii* has a yellow small orbital ring, black strip before eye not in Squacco heron and Chinese pond heron (Figure 1-13), but has a large greenish-yellow or dull-yellow orbital ring, and lacking of black strip before eyes also they have dull-yellow or greenish-yellow legs, not in Indian pond heron *A. grayii* (Figure 14).

- 1. The bird Squacco pond heron (Figure 11-13), are rare or scarce or winter visitor or vagarant.
- 2. The bird Chinese pond heron might be winter visitor, but overlooked due to it is a resemble of Indian Pond heron, so it is very indistinguishable during winter plumage.
